Please find enclosed an Application pursuant to the 1980 Hague Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction on behalf of Mr. Nir Velozny, seeking to the return to Israel of his children R V and V and E V and E V The original and attachments shall follow by mail.

According to Mr. Velozny, on September 27, 2019 the mother left Israel with the children without his knowledge or consent and took them to the United States (where the mother's parents live). According to the father, since the abduction the mother has not allowed him any contact with his children.

The father has requested that your Central Authority contact the mother to inquire as to whether she would agree to voluntarily return the children to Israel, failing which he wishes that proceedings be instituted in the authorized court for the return of the children.

The father claims that he is financially incapable of hiring an attorney in the United States, and therefore requests representation through a pro bono attorney. He has filled out a request for legal assistance, which is attached hereto.

IV. Time, date, place and circumstances of the wrongful removal or retention.

According to the father, the parents have resided together in Israel since 2004. The three children were born and raised in Israel since birth. Recently, the parents decided to get divorced, and had started negotiating an arrangement.

On September 28, 2019, the father discovered that the mother and children were missing and he contacted the Israel police. The police informed him that on September 27, 2019 the mother had left Israel with the children and had taken them to the United States (where the mother's parents live). The father states that the removal of the children by the mother was done without his knowledge or consent.

According to the father, since the abduction the mother has not allowed him any contact with his children.

V. Factual and Legal Background Justifying This Request

1) Habitual Residence is Israel

According to the father, the children were born and raised in Israel. In addition, the children attended school and kindergarten in Israel until the abduction. Therefore, Israel is the children's habitual residence.

2) The requesting party has Custodial Rights under Israeli Law

Pursuant to sections 14 and 15 of Israel's Capacity and Guardianship Law 1962 (enclosed), parents are the joint legal guardians of their minor children, and this includes the right to custody and the right to determine the children's place of residence. Therefore, the father has custodial rights under Israeli Law.

3) The Requesting Party Exercised His Custodial Rights Prior to The Wrongful Removal/Retention

The father states that prior to the removal the children were living together with him and the mother and that he has been involved in their care since birth. Until that time, he had been exercising his custodial rights on a daily basis.

Therefore, the mother's removal of the children from Israel to the United States without the father's knowledge or consent was done in violation of the his custodial rights that he was exercising at the time, and thus constitutes a wrongful retention within the meaning of Article 3 of the Hague Convention.

4) Civil proceedings in progress between the parties.

The father applied for a dispute settlement in the Rabbinical Court. A hearing that was scheduled for 3 October, 2019 did not take place due to the mother's absence.
